- As a classical composer I have written pieces for ensembles such as Neue Vocalsolisten, Ensemble Adapter, Arctic Philharmonic Sinfonietta, Danish National Symphony Orchestra, and Athelas Sinfonietta. I also cofounded the new music ensemble NEKO3.
- My music has been performed around Europe, in China, and in the US. I've been selected for festivals such as Klang Festival, G((o))ng Tomorrow, SPOR Festival, NJORD Biennale, Dark Music Days in Reykjavik, Young Nordic Music Festival in Helsinki, Nordic Music Days in Tórshavn, Sound of Stockholm, and NYCEMF in New York.
